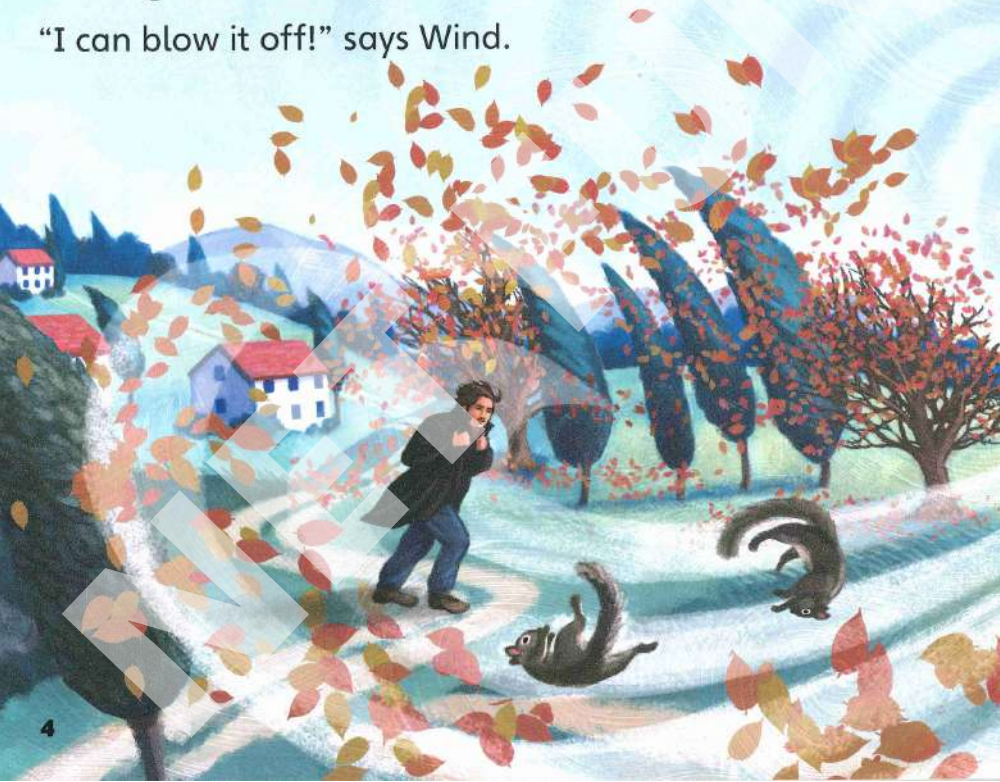

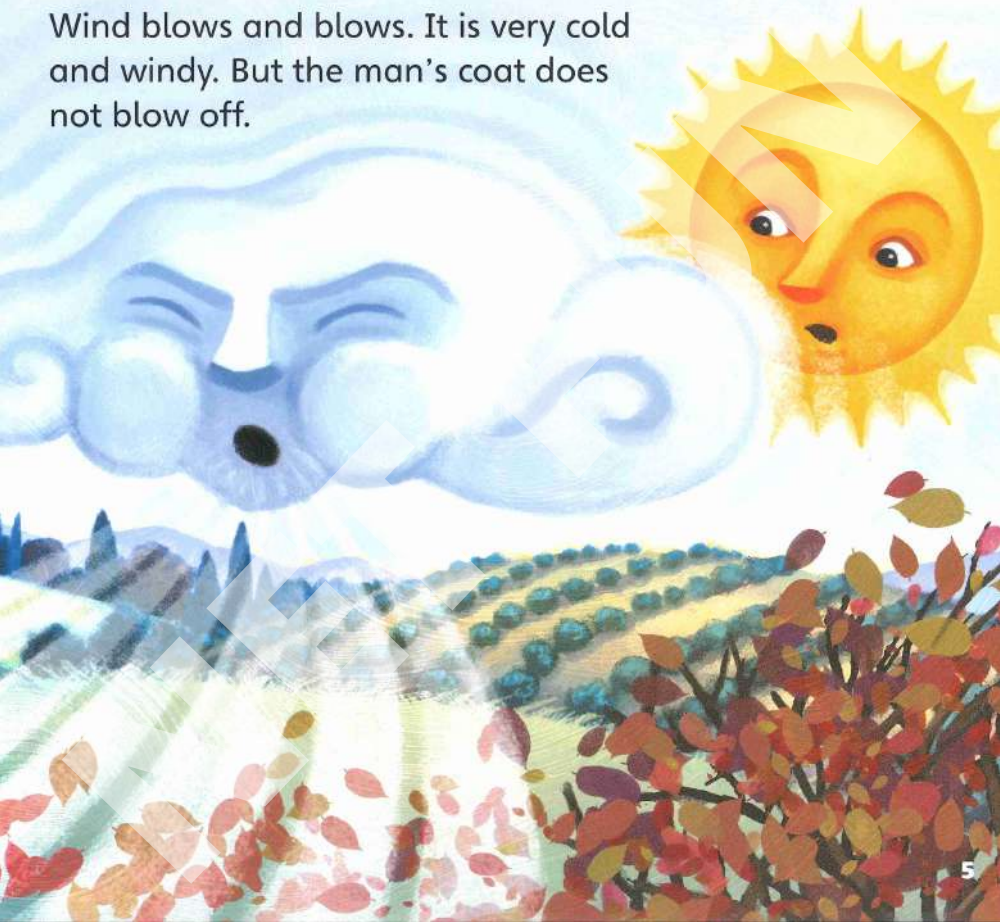
Wind blows.

“I can blow it off!” says Wind.

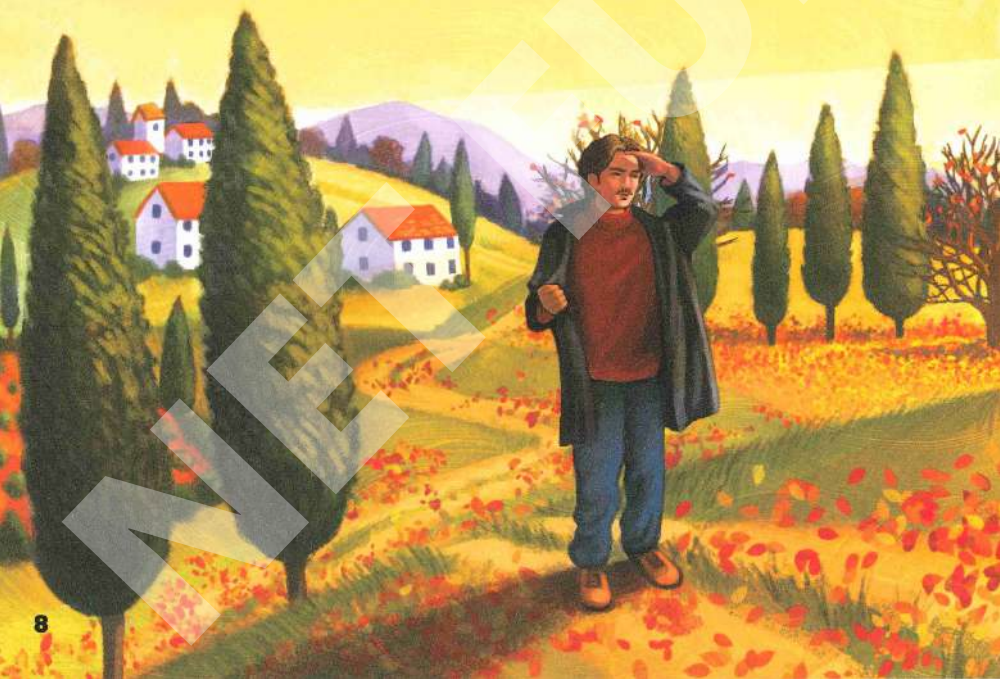


Wind blows and blows. It is very cold and windy. But the man's coat does not blow off.

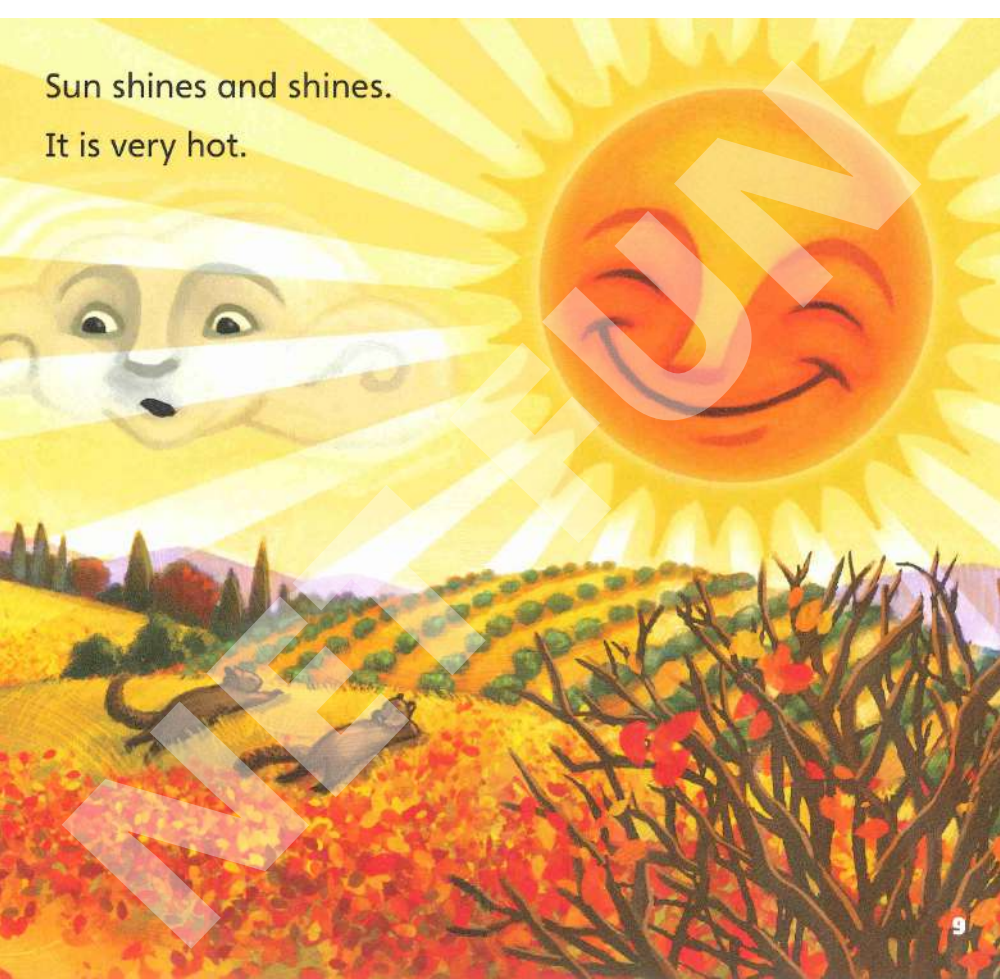


Sun shines on the man.

It is very hot.

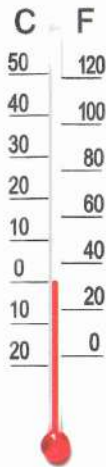


Facts About Temperature

Is it hot today? Is it cold? A **thermometer** can tell you!

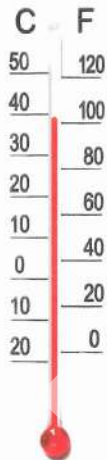
A thermometer measures **temperature**.
