








"You worked very hard," says Cheng's mother. "That is the important thing. Take your empty pot to the emperor. Tell him you tried very hard."

So Cheng takes his pot to the palace.




At the palace, all the gardeners have beautiful plants.

Only you are good and honest. So you will be the next emperor!"






# Facts About Plants

Most plants and trees come from seeds. Seeds and plants have different parts.


### Parts of a Seed

A seed has a baby plant inside it. This is called an embryo. The embryo has food around it that helps it grow. When it is in soil, the seed needs water and sunlight to grow. It starts as a tiny plant, called a seedling.




## **Parts of a Plant**

The seedling grows into a plant. The plant gets water and food from the soil through its roots. The stem brings water and food from the roots to the leaves and flowers. The leaves also use sunlight to make more food.



Plants start as seeds. Then those seeds grow into plants, and those plants make more seeds. This process is called



# Life Cycle of an Apple

Apples have seeds in them. A tiny seedling grows from the seed. In a few years, the seedling becomes a tree. The tree grows buds. Flowers grow from the buds. Then apples grow where the flowers were.
