





The brother picked a pumpkin for his dinner. But when he cut it open, the pumpkin was filled with gold and jewels!


He cut open more pumpkins. Every one had treasure in it.

The younger brother was now the richest man in the village!










The greedy brother took the bird home and cared for it. When the bird's wing was better, the brother got ready to let it go.
