They both show excitement.]


NARRATOR 1: Welcome to Black Lake Summer Camp!

[LUCIA pulls out a piece of paper and unfolds it. It's a lunar calendar for July.]

tucia: Today is the new moon. [points to new moon on calendar] I knew Emma would be at the flagpole tonight because it would be so dark.



**EMMA:** I'm so proud of you, Lucia. Good job! You win the prize!


[EMMA pulls a special, colorful flag out of her pocket. She takes a marker and writes "LUCIA" on the flag. Then she runs the flag up the flagpole.]

[JASPER and WES come running up to the flagpole.]

**JASPER:** [worried] What's all the commotion about?

WES: [anxious] We heard you yelling!

**EMMA:** Everyone is fine. Lucia caught me sneaking out here with the socks!


## **Phases of the Moon**

The moon's shape seems to change over time. Each shape is a **phase** of the moon.

The sun lights half of the moon. You might see all of the moon's sunlit half as it revolves around Earth. That is a full moon. You might see part of it. That is a crescent, quarter, or gibbous moon. Or you might not see any of it. That is a new moon.

The phases follow a pattern. You see more of the moon when it is **waxing.** You see less of the moon when it is **waning.** The time from one new moon to the next new moon is about a month.

# Phases of the Moon



## Why a Quarter Moon?

Look at the first quarter moon.
During this phase, the moon
looks like half of a circle. So why
is this phase called a quarter
moon? Remember, the moon
revolves around Earth. In this
phase, the moon has finished
one quarter of its trip around
Earth. That's why this phase is
called a quarter moon.

The moon can be seen sometimes during the day and sometimes at night.
